

DAILY DEVOTIONS

Memory Verse — Ephesians 4:1 I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, ² with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, ³ eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

Heidelberg Catechism 37 What do you understand by the words, "He suffered?" That he, all the time that he lived on earth, but especially at the end of his life, sustained in body and soul, the wrath of God against the sins of all mankind: that so by his passion, as the only propitiatory sacrifice, he might redeem our body and soul from everlasting damnation, and obtain for us the favor of God, righteousness and eternal life.

Monday: Eph 5:1-2. What are the two main commands here? What does it mean to imitate God? How does v 2 explain v 1? Do you consciously imitate anyone (1 Pet 2:21-24, 1 Cor 11:1, 3 Jn 11, 1 Jn 4:11)? Are you imitate-able? Today, how can you walk in love like Jesus loves?

Tuesday: Eph 5:1-2. How do you think an unbeliever would define love in "walk in love"? How does v 2 demonstrate that Christian love is different (e.g. who defines love, is there an objective standard, is it costly/sacrificial)? How is love stronger and more potent than kindness (Rom 12:9)? How would you define love? Is your love kind and strong?

Wednesday: Eph 4:31-5:2. Gal 2:20 tells us our lives need to be cruciform. What is the cost of love according to v 31? What feels good about bitterness, anger, slander? Why are they costly to lay aside? Why is it more difficult yet to practice v 32 instead of v 31? Ask the Spirit to encourage you where you're doing well, but to convict you unto change where you need it. Honor God by doing your homework (Mt 5:23f, 6:12, 14)!

Thursday: Eph 5:2. Look at Lev 1:17 for the backdrop of this fragrant offering. Tying in God's justice and mercy, how is Jesus this fragrant offering (Heb 7:25-27)? How does Jesus' sacrifice "for you" move your heart to love sacrificially? How do the three "as's" of 4:31-5:2 form a strong argument for you to forgive, love, sacrifice?

Friday: Eph 4:31-5:2. Because of Christ's sacrifice, you are his "beloved child." Trace this theme through 1:4c, 2:4, 3:16-19. Will you spray weed-killer on your bitterness? Will you commit to putting away shouting, anger? Where love need to be more than kindness? How will you walk in love? Who will enjoy the fragrance of your costly service? How is God exalted when you live this way?

Saturday: Read Psalm 74. Where do you see God's faithfulness in this Psalm even in the calamity?
