

DAILY DEVOTIONS

Memory Verse — Ephesians 3:17b-19 that you, being rooted and grounded in love, ¹⁸ may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, ¹⁹ and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

Heidelberg Catechism 112 What is required in the ninth commandment? That I bear false witness against no man, nor falsify any man's words; that I be no backbiter, nor slanderer; that I do not judge, nor join in condemning any man rashly, or unheard; but that I avoid all sorts of lies and deceit, as the proper works of the devil, unless I would bring down upon me the heavy wrath of God; likewise, that in judgment and all other dealings I love the truth, speak it uprightly and confess it; also that I defend and promote, as much as I am able, the honor and good character of my neighbor.

Monday: Eph 4:25. How is falsehood or deceit the devil's dialect (Jn 8:44, Rev 12:9)? Consider and turn from where you are tempted to lie, cheat, deceive, shade truth, exaggerate, etc. Why are we to put away falsehood according to Eph 4:20, 22, 1:15?

Tuesday: Eph 4:25. What are we to put on? How can you speak truth in the areas of temptation in question 1? Why is it sometimes hard to speak the truth (e.g. confrontation, evangelism)? What reason does v 25 give for speaking the truth? Ponder the impact on the church/relationships of deceit, or not speaking truth to others?

Wednesday: Eph 4:26. "Be angry." Why would Paul command us to be angry sometimes? What sorts of things ought we to be angry about (Ex 32:19, Rom 12:9)? Anger is to be against something. Do you stand against (your own) sin, and sin that offends God?

Thursday: Eph 4:26-27. How does "do not sin" wipe out much of our anger? When does anger become sinful (e.g. Prov 14:29, Mt 5:22, Rom 12:19, James 1:19)? What limitation should we put on our anger? Is the point a literal time-stamp? What is the heart desire that motivates your anger (e.g. respect, control)? Repent of this, and turn to Christ instead.

Friday: Eph 4:26-27. What motivation does Paul give for standing against sin but controlling our anger? Opportunity can be translated as "place, foothold." How does uncontrolled anger, sinful anger, or enduring anger give the devil a place to ruin relationships and unity? How does this motivate you to righteous living?

Saturday: Eph 4:28-30. Consider the motivation Paul gives in v 30. Pray for the service tomorrow.
