



DAILY DEVOTIONS

Memory Verse — Ephesians 3:20-21 ²⁰Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, ²¹to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen.

Heidelberg Catechism 111: But what does God require in the eighth commandment (don't steal)? *That I promote the advantage of my neighbor in every instance I can or may; and deal with him as I desire to be dealt with by others: further also that I faithfully labor, so that I may be able to relieve the needy.*

Monday: Eph 4:28. Consider the extent of the 8th commandment's commands and forbiddings (1 Tim 6:6, 8-10, 17-19). What is the attitude behind theft? The desire? What's your attitude toward money and possessions? How do you handle them? How often do you think about them? Do you over-prize? Envy? Display a "take, take" heart? Be honest with God about this in prayer. Fight to put this off.

Tuesday: Eph 4:28. Put off stealing. What are we to put on instead? What reason is given? How can you actually practice this this week? How can you attitude reflect generosity and giving? What moves someone to gladly share their hard-earned money (Luke 19:5-9, 2 Cor 8:1-9)? Renew your mind with the riches and grace of Christ.

Wednesday: Eph 4:28. According to these verses, how should we work (Eph 6:6-7)? Is work part of creation, as in, is it part of God's good design (Gen 1:15, Jn 5:17)? Who do we reflect when we work? What is your attitude toward your work? How can you honor God with your work-attitude, and your work itself?

Thursday: Eph 4:29. Our words are to "build up." Consider God's building project in 2:19-22. Think of this command as "Beautify Jesus' church with your mouth." What ingredients should go into the words we deliberately choose? As those who have received life-words from Jesus, how will you give grace today with your mouth?

Friday: Eph 4:30. What motivation does Paul add to the command to use our mouths to give grace? What is the Spirit building/doing (2:22)? In whom (3:13, 21)? For what is he preparing us (1:13-14)? Whose mark/seal do we bear (1:13)? How do caustic, destructive words affect his work? Can you think of examples of this? How is this a motivation to use our words as Jesus does?

Saturday: Read Ephesians 4:31-5:2. What does it look like to walk in love, or to imitate God?
