

DAILY DEVOTIONS

Memory Text — Ephesians 5:3-4 ³ But sexual immorality and all impurity or covetousness must not even be named among you, as is proper among saints. ⁴ Let there be no filthiness nor foolish talk nor crude joking, which are out of place, but instead let there be thanksgiving.

Heidelberg Catechism 104: What does God require in the fifth commandment? That I show all honor, love and fidelity, to my father and mother, and all in authority over me, and submit myself to their good instruction and correction, with due obedience; and also patiently bear with their weaknesses and infirmities, since it pleases God to govern us by their hand.

Monday: Eph 5:22. How do the following texts help explain what God is and isn't saying regarding wives submitting to their husbands (Gen 1:27, Eph 2:16, 5:1-2, 5:18)? Husbands have the responsibility to lead, but how does the command of mutual submission in fear of Christ inform this (e.g. Eph 4:15-16, Phil 2:3-4)?

Tuesday: Eph 5:22-23. Submission is yielding our lives to Christ and God's order in love. Who all is called to submit in vv 21-6:9? Why must one be Spirit-filled to do this? In marriage the wife is called to yield in love to her husband's leading, care. How is submission different from obedience? Subjugation? Control?

Wednesday: Eph 5:22-23. What is your attitude to (your husband's) leadership? Is it one of respect, inclination to follow, encouragement? Or are you dismissive, aloof, or do you tend to dominate or control? How does v 33 get to the heart attitude of submission? How is 1 Pet 3:5's "hoped in God" key to this? How can you affirm, support, respect, encourage, and pray for your (husband's) leaders/ship?

Thursday: Eph 5:22-24. Jesus is the head of the church (Eph 1:22, 4:15-16, Col 2:19) and thus leads and provides for her. What does this look like according to vv 25-30? Husbands, are you leading (especially spiritually)? Is your leadership characterized by love, care, and what's best for your wife/family? Wives, are you thankful for, open to, and receiving his leadership? Talk about this together. Repent and forgive.

Friday: Read Eph 5:22-35. Do you see God's intent of a beautiful relationship that works in concert together, in love for one another even as expressed in differing roles? No marriage hits this perfectly -our hope must be in Christ. But to what reality does marriage point us (Rev 21:1-4)?

Saturday: Eph 5:25-33. Read this text looking for ways to thank and praise Jesus.
