DAILY DEVOTIONS

Memory Text — Psalm 46:1 ¹God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

Westminster Catechism 7 What is God? God is a Spirit, in and of himself infinite in being, glory, blessedness, and perfection; all-sufficient, eternal, unchangeable, incomprehensible, everywhere present, almighty, knowing all things, most wise, most holy, most just, most merciful and gracious, long-suffering, and abundant in goodness and truth.

Monday: What is the foundational Christian truth we confess in Psalm 46:1? What does "refuge" emphasize contrasted with "strength" and "very present help"? How does such a God leave you with no reason for being undone by fear (v 2)? How has God has been your refuge in the past? Leverage that for confidence to profess that God is *still* your refuge (see Heb 6:17-18, Rom 8:35)?

Tuesday: Ps 46:1-3. What kinds of troubles do vv 2-3 paint? How does God's now-tottering creation show how we can feel about God in such chaos (Ps 104:5)? Can you tie these pictures to anything you're going through now? Where to you tend to look for help, security, comfort, when things are chaos/turmoil? Actively put your chaos into the context of who God is *for you* his adopted child (v 1).

Wednesday: Contrast the uproar of Ps 46:2-3 with v 4-5. How does the allusion to Gen 2:10-14 help understand what the Psalmist wants us to understand from this river? Although there is no river in Jerusalem, what water makes God's city glad (v 5, Ezek 47:1, Rev 22:1-2)? How does Jesus fulfill this (Jn 4:13-15)? How does the Spirit cause you to rejoice because of Christ and all his benefits and promises (Acts 16:25, Rom 8:28, 5:3-5, etc)?

Thursday: How does Psalm 46:6-10 portray God's power? What is he inviting us to take in (v 8), what future reality are we meant to think about in trouble (vvv 8-9, Is 2:4, Rev 21:3-4)? Given vv 6-9, who needs to 'be quiet' before him? How does living in light of God's purpose to be exalted (v 10), and the future kingdom of peace change your perspective on your current troubles?

Friday: How do you see God's transcendence (greatness, majesty, power) in Ps 46:11? How do you see his immanence (nearness) in the same verse? Ponder how those two are tied together with the little word "our" -God in all his might has bound us to himself in covenant, by promise. Can your fortress be shaken?! Pray for a deeper rest in God.

Saturday: Read Phil 5:25-33 and note all that Christ does for his church. Pray for the service tomorrow.
