The Object of Our Faith (Assurance of Pardon) — Hebrews 11:39-12:3

³⁹ And all these, though commended through their faith, did not receive what was promised, ⁴⁰ since God had provided something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, ² looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

²³ By faith Moses, when he was born, was hidden for three months by his parents, because they saw that the child was beautiful, and they were not afraid of the king's edict. ²⁴ By faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, ²⁵ choosing rather to be mistreated with the people of God than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. ²⁶ He considered the reproach of Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, for he was looking to the reward. ²⁷ By faith he left Egypt, not being afraid of the anger of the king, for he endured as seeing him who is invisible. ²⁸ By faith he kept the Passover and sprinkled the blood, so that the Destroyer of the firstborn might not touch them.



Ministry Highlights

We are highlighting one or two ministries in the bulletin each week to help folks know about the various ministries in the church, who oversees them, and how they function. Please take some time to read these highlights so that you will have more knowledge and know if maybe you might want to serve in any of them!

Sunday School

The session of New Hope believes that Sunday school is an important part of the life of the church and is a way to help the congregation grow in faith and understanding of the scriptures. New Hope provides Sunday school for all ages beginning in Preschool (age 3). Sunday school is divided into trimesters following the resting month schedule. During the resting months of April, August and December there is no Sunday school The elementary Sunday school (PS-MS) uses Great Commissions Publications for their curriculum is. If a child attends Sunday school regularly, the will receive teaching of the whole Bible at least 2 times. High School classes are aimed to prepare students for faith and life after high school. Adult classes alternate between study of Bible books, practical classes, theology, etc.

Kim Jernigan oversees the elementary Sunday school program and the edification committee oversees the High school and adult classes. Teachers for all ages are always needed but you must be a member to be a teacher (helpers need not be members). Please talk to Kim Jernigan if you are interested in teaching PS-MS or Pastor Francis/elder Dave Myers if you are interested in teaching high school or adult classes.

DAILY DEVOTIONS

Memory Text — **Ephesians 6:13-15** ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. ¹⁴ Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, ¹⁵ and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace.

Westminster Confession 14.3 (of Saving Faith) This faith is different in degrees, weak or strong; may be often and many ways assailed, and weakened, but gets the victory: growing up in many to the attainment of a full assurance, through Christ, who is both the author and finisher of our faith.

Monday: Eph 6:16. Why is the devil called "the evil one"? What does that say about his designs? What kinds of fiery arrows does the devil shoot at Christians (e.g. thoughts, desires, temptations, attacks, etc.)? Why (e.g. Luke 22:32)? Can you name a few specific fiery arrows Satan regularly shoots at you? Pray for strength to resist.

Tuesday: Eph 6:16. How did the following aspects of the shield help in battle: huge size, thick iron rim at top, big knob on front, water-soaked skin cover? How would you feel it? Read Gen 15:1, 2 Sam 22:3, 31, 36. Who is your shield? Imagine you carried this shield all day today -and every arrow of the devil bounced of it. How would that change your day?

Wednesday: Eph 6:16. The shield of faith is us exercising our trust in God, putting what we know to be true to work. How has Paul prayed for this in Eph 1:19, 3:16-17, 20-21? Consider how Shadrach, David, Esther, and the church rested in God's power and what it resulted in (Dan 3:17f, 1 Sam 17:45, Est 4:16, Acts 4:29-31). Where will you exercise your trust in God's power?

Thursday: Eph 6:16. We are to exercise a lively trust in God's promises. What are some of those promises (e.g. Mt 7:11, 1 Cor 10:13, Phil 1:6, 4:19, 2 Cor 4:17)? Do you have an especially meaningful promise? How does God's promise of steadfast love help David in times of despair and doubt (Ps 42:5, 7, 8-11)? Live "on" a certain promise today. Pray it a lot.

Friday: Eph 6:16. What are some false shields you sometimes use? How helpful are they in sickness, disappointment, loss? Your faith is only as reliable and helpful as the trustworthiness of its object. Who is the object of our faith? Where is he now (Heb 12:2, Rom 8:34)? How is He sufficient to help us resist "all" the flaming darts of the evil one? Let's trust in him! Let's ask him for help!

Saturday: Read Eph 6:17. How do you think the helmet of salvation helps you stand against the devil's schemes?
