Prelude

Call to Worship — Isaiah 59:14-17 (responsive) ¹⁴ Justice is turned back, and righteousness stands far away; for truth has stumbled in the public squares, and uprightness cannot enter. ¹⁵ Truth is lacking, and he who departs from evil makes himself a prey. The LORD saw it, and it displeased him that there was no justice. ¹⁶ He saw that there was no man, and wondered that there was no one to intercede; then his own arm brought him salvation, and his righteousness upheld him. ¹⁷ He put on righteousness as a breastplate, and a helmet of salvation on his head; he put on garments of vengeance for clothing, and wrapped himself in zeal as a cloak.

Confession of Sin — Philippians 3:4-8

If anyone else thinks he has reason for confidence in the flesh, I have more: ⁵ circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; ⁶ as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blame-less. ⁷ But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. ⁸ Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord.

Assurance of Pardon — Philippians 3:8-11

For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ ⁹ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith— ¹⁰ that I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, ¹¹ that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

Offering* — Hebrews 11:24-26 ²⁴ By faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, ²⁵ choosing rather to be mistreated with the people of God than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. ²⁶ He considered the reproach of Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, for he was looking to the reward.

Ministry Highlights

- Over the next several weeks, we are going to highlight one or two ministries in the bulletin to help folks know about the various ministries in the church, who oversees them, and how they function. Please take some time to read these highlights so that you will have more knowledge and know if maybe you might want to serve in any of them!
- Welcome Team Ministry: The Welcome Team ministry consists of about 20 ushers and greeters who have been tasked to welcome members and visitors, to be available to answer any and all possible questions pertaining to church and/or Sunday morning activities, and generally make people feel welcome. Ushers make coffee every Sunday morning prior to Sunday school beginning, they help take up the offering, they help seat people as needed, and they are the first line of security for the church. The greeters man both sets of doors and greet each person who enters, giving out bulletins, with an eye out for any visitors that may need help or to be greeted.

The welcome team also invites folks new to the church to fill out visitor information cards so that they can be contacted either by one of the welcome team leaders or the pastor. Memory Text — Ephesians 6:13 ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm.

Heidelberg Catechism 60. How are you righteous before God? Only by a true faith in Jesus Christ; so that, though my conscience accuse me, that I have grossly transgressed all the commandments of God, and kept none of them, and am still inclined to all evil; notwithstanding, God, without any merit of mine, but only of mere grace, grants and imputes to me, the perfect satisfaction, righteousness and holiness of Christ; even so, as if I never had had, nor committed any sin: yea, as if I had fully accomplished all that obedience which Christ has accomplished for me; inasmuch as I embrace such benefit with a believing heart.

Monday: Read Eph 6:14 about the breastplate and Isaiah 59:1-4, 14, 15, 20. What's wrong with God's people in Isaiah? What does God do about it? How does Isaiah inform our understanding of Ephesians 6:14? Why is God's action essential for salvation, and why is this such good news?

Tuesday: Eph 6:14. How does Rom 3:21-24 explain what the breastplate of righteousness is? To whom is our sin imputed (reckoned, counted)? What does Christ impute to us (Phil 3:9)? This is called double imputation. How complete is Christ's payment? How full is the righteousness he gives you? Reflect on the catechism above.

Wednesday: Eph 6:14. Think about times Satan, others, and yourself have made you feel guilty. How do you often respond, even if you really are guilty (e.g. argue, blame, excuse, how can you even be a Christian)? How does having Jesus' complete and perfect forgiveness change this (Rom 8:1, Gal 5:1)? How does it change your response to sin?

Thursday: Eph 6:14. Do you ever compare yourself to others? Why? How does that make you feel? Satan (others, self) often highlights our unworthiness and shame, and we easily counter with comparison (or despair). How does the breastplate of righteousness help us fight this (see Phil 3:7-9, Zech 3:4-5)?

Friday: Eph 6:14. How does the breastplate of righteousness help you when you feel filthy? What is God's perspective? Since the believer wears Christ's perfect record, and his/her sinful record is fully paid, how are we respond (Rom 6:17-18, Phil 3:10a, Rom 12:1)?

Saturday: Read Jonah chapter 1. Where do you see God's sovereign hand?
