



DAILY DEVOTIONS

Memory Verse: Ephesians 6:19-20 ¹⁷ and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, ¹⁸ praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints, ¹⁹ and also for me, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel, ²⁰ for which I am an ambassador in chains, that I may declare it boldly, as I ought to speak.

Westminster Confession 18.1 Of Assurance of Grace and Salvation. Yet such as truly believe in the Lord Jesus, and love Him in sincerity, endeavoring to walk in all good conscience before Him, may, in this life, be certainly assured that they are in the state of grace, and may rejoice in the hope of the glory of God, which hope shall never make them ashamed.

Monday: Luke 1:67-68. How do you think not believing in God, or believing we exist by chance produces despair and purposelessness? Do people ever really avoid worshipping something? God had been silent for 400 years. Do you think Israel ever wondered if God was really there (would their sin, failure, and even persecution compound that)? How do vv 67-68 answer some of those questions and speak hope?

Tuesday: Luke 1:69. For what do unbelievers seek "salvation" (e.g. happiness)? How do they try find salvation (e.g. self-actualizing, success)? How do you think the failure of David's throne to produce salvation affected the Jews (v 69)? How does "salvation is from the Lord" in v 69 produce renewed hope? How is Jesus a "horn of salvation"?

Wednesday: Read Luke 1:68-74 and Acts 4:24-30. How has Christ already saved and delivered us from our enemies (see also Col 1:13). How does that give confidence in the battle against sin? How has he not yet delivered us from our enemies? How does that give courage and comfort when sinned against or in trial?

Thursday: Read Luke 1:76-77 and Psalm 32:1-5. This forgiveness of sins is a big deal for Zechariah. Do you think it is for us today? Why or why not? Do you feel conviction and grief over sin? Ask the Holy Spirit to work greater conviction of sin in you so that you might be more joyful as you taste the "tender mercy" of God in Christ in v 77.

Friday: Read Luke 1:78-79 and Isaiah 9:1-6. What is the darkness of Isaiah 9:1-2 (see Isaiah 8:19-22, 8:5-8)? How is Jesus' coming the dawn of salvation from judgment? What despair, frustration, futility, and sorrow do you experience, and have you seen? How does Jesus' birth, life, death, and resurrection testify that the light will overcome the darkness?

Saturday: Read Luke 2:14. How does Christmas deliver the gift of peace?
