### Ministry Highlights

We are highlighting one or two ministries in the bulletin each week to help folks know about the various ministries in the church, who oversees them, and how they function. This week we are going to highlight and give a broad overview of the five main committees of the church.

**Sound Team,** As a team, they strive to provide New Hope with a sound quality that is not distracting from worship, but as an enhancement to sharing God's message. They make sure that the musicians and instruments are well blended and not too loud or soft by having a thorough understanding of the sound board. They provide hearing assistance for those who need it. They make sure anyone speaking has microphones and they maintain all the sound equipment. # DAILY DEVOTIONS

**Memory Text** — Ephesians 6:16-17 <sup>16</sup> In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; <sup>17</sup> and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God...

**Westminster Confession 1.5 Of the Holy Scripture:** [There are many] arguments whereby [the Bible] does abundantly evidence itself to be the Word of God: yet notwithstanding, our full persuasion and assurance of the infallible truth and divine authority thereof, is from the inward work of the Holy Spirit bearing witness by and with the Word in our hearts.

**Monday:** Eph 6:11-12, 17. Consider moments of darkness through history: Gen 6:5, 1 Kings 19:9, Rev 12:17. Where do you see the dark lord's power and influence in the world, our country, our city, your relationships, and your life? Cry out about these things to the one who is greater than he who is in the world (John 16:33, 1 Jn 4:4).

**Tuesday**: Eph 6:17b. Among the armor, what is unique about the sword? What does the sword represent? Why is the sword "of the Spirit" (2 Tim 3:16, 2 Pet 1:19)? Why else (Eph 1:18)? If the Spirit both supplies and empowers the Word, how reliable and dependable is it? How can you better live in full confidence of this truth?

**Wednesday:** Eph 6:17b. God intends the sword of the Spirit to be used for defense. How do you see Jesus do this in Mt 4:1-4? Where are you commonly attacked? Have you found Scripture to counter this attack? What is the sin (love, motivation, idol) under that sin? What Scriptures can you use to defend against the root sin?

**Thursday:** Eph 6:17b. How are Christians to use the sword offensively? Look over Acts 2:37-41. How do you see the Spirit empower the Bible's truth here? What effect does it have? Who can you pray for that the Spirit enlivens by the Word? Are you seeking to share the gospel with someone for their good, and God's glory? Remember, the Spirit uses the Word, and it is Him doing the work. We need to be faithful.

**Friday:** Eph 6:10-17. What has been most helpful to you from the armor of God? What has God provided for you? What is your responsibility with each item? God would have you resist the devil, stand firm in faith, and overcome (see Rev 2:7, 11, 21:7). Press on! Fight hard! Keep looking to Jesus in faith.

**Saturday:** Read Titus 2:11-13. What does grace do here? Pray for tomorrow's service.
