

#### **Invitation to the Lord's Supper**

Since it is our privilege today to celebrate the blessed sacrament of the Lord's Supper, we are called to prepare our hearts by rightly examining ourselves.

"Do This in Remembrance of Me," says Jesus as He invites us to His Holy Supper. It is not only a privilege, but also a personal responsibility to respond to this gracious invitation. The apostle Paul alerts us to this responsibility in 1 Corinthians 11:27, "Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord." Furthermore, the Lord, through the Apostle Paul also instructs us that those who eat and drink "without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgement on himself."

In light of the scriptural teaching, the elders invite you to join in the communion celebration on the basis of the following personal affirmations:

- 1. I confess that I am a sinner and repent of my sins.
- 2. I have been baptized into the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.
- 3. I believe in Jesus as my Savior and Lord who forgives all my sins because of His sacrifice.
- 4. I desire to show my thankfulness to God by resolving to live in faith and obedience before my Lord, and in love and peace with my neighbors.
- 5. I have made a public profession of faith in a church that recognizes the sovereign authority of God's Word and that we are saved only by grace through faith in Jesus Christ.
- 6. I am not under the discipline of my home church.

If, for some reason, you do not believe you should partake of communion with God's people at this time, the elders would then urge you to refrain from participating today and they would also urge you to actively seek out either one of the elders or the pastor for further instruction. They are eager and willing to discuss these matters in light of God's Word, as they are called to tend to these matters for the purity of Christ's Church, His Glory, and the good of His people.

We are confident that the Savior accepts us at His table when we come in faith, with sorrow for our sins, and with a will to follow Him as He commands.

## DAILY DEVOTIONS

**Memory Text** — Genesis 1:1-2 In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. <sup>2</sup> The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.

**Belgic Confession article 12: Of the Creation** — We believe that the Father, by the Word, that is, by his Son, hath created of nothing, the heaven, the earth, and all creatures, as it seemed good unto him, giving unto every creature its being, shape, form, and several offices to serve its Creator....

**Monday:** Gen 1:1. Have you ever been told that when a character/person dies they become part of nature (e.g. a star)? Have you heard people refer to mother nature? Do you know of any religions that teach we become gods or part of One when we die? How does Genesis 1:1 distinguish between Creation and created? Can we ever become God? Consider how we're tempted to be or to play God and repent of it.

**Tuesday**: According to Gen 1:1, did God use any materials to create the world (Heb 11:3, Rev 4:11)? "Create" here is unique -used only of God, and of his creating out of nothing. What all did God create out of nothing? If this is true, then why must we conclude that he is the Sovereign Creator? Is God only transcendent, or is he also imminent? Why do both matter?

**Wednesday:** Gen 1:1. How is worship a natural outflow of God being the Sovereign Creator? Linger over Ps 95:2-5, Is 40:11-15, 25-26, Ps 33:7-8, Job 38 and pray God moves you to praise/worship him for his creativity, majesty, glory.

**Thursday:** Gen 1:1. How is obedience a natural outflow of God being the Sovereign Creator? How do you see this connection between Creator and obedience in Eccles 12:1, Prov 14:31, Rom 1:25-31? How does God as Sovereign Creator clash with the autonomy of my feelings, desires, and definitions in today's culture? Pray for a new obedience (Eph 2:10), and for those given to autonomy.

**Friday:** Gen 1:1. How does Ps 124:8 apply the theology of God as Sovereign Creator? How does 1 Pet 4:19 do the same thing in a different way? How does Jesus work (2 Cor 5:17-18) give us the strength and desire to walk in worship, obedience, and rest?

Saturday: Read Genesis 1:1-2. What was the Spirit doing in hovering?
