# Confession of Sin — Ephesians 5:5-14

<sup>5</sup> For you may be sure of this, that everyone who is sexually immoral or impure, or who is covetous (that is, an idolater), has no inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God. <sup>6</sup> Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of these things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience. <sup>7</sup> Therefore do not become partners with them; <sup>8</sup> for at one time you were darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light <sup>9</sup> (for the fruit of light is found in all that is good and right and true), <sup>10</sup> and try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord. <sup>11</sup> Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them. <sup>12</sup> For it is shameful even to speak of the things that they do in secret. <sup>13</sup> But when anything is exposed by the light, it becomes visible, <sup>14</sup> for anything that becomes visible is light. Therefore it says,

"Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you."

## **Assurance of Pardon** — Colossians 1:15-20

<sup>15</sup>He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. <sup>16</sup>For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him. <sup>17</sup>And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together. <sup>18</sup>And he is the head of the body, the church. ## DAILY DEVOTIONS

**Memory Text** — Genesis 1:1-2 In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. <sup>2</sup>The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.

**Westminster Confession 4.1** It pleased God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, for the manifestation of the glory of His eternal power, wisdom, and goodness, in the beginning, to create, or make of nothing, the world, and all things therein whether visible or invisible, in the space of six days; and all very good.

**Monday:** Gen 1:3-13. Note all the times God acts in these verses. How many times do you read "and God said"? What happens when God speaks? What does this reveal about God's character? How does this compel us to worship him (Rev 4:11)? What does this tell you about God's power (Heb 1:3)? What would change in you if you really believed God was this powerful?

**Tuesday**: Gen 1:2 says the earth was "without form," or "disordered." What three ways does God order the earth to prepare it for life in Gen 3:3-13? Just like God pushed back the darkness, how does Jesus bring a deeper light into the darkness (Jn 1:4-5)? Think of a few specific ways Jesus casts brighter light on the character of God.

**Wednesday:** Look at Gen 1:3-27 for its literary beauty. Count the number of times you read "and God said," "it was good/very good." Can you see the parallel pattern of forming (days 1-3) and filling (days 4-6)? Call to mind some of the most beautiful sunsets/clouds you've ever seen. How does Jesus form beauty out of ashes (Is 61:3, Phil 4:8, Eph 5:26-27)? Pray for more of this

**Thursday:** Gen 1:3-13. God's end goal was not simply a "formed" earth, but a "filled" earth. Ponder details of the lush earth God has made as described in vv 11-13. How is this lush landscape later pictured for God's recreative work (Ps 1:3, Is 35:1ff, 61:3, Rev 22:1ff). How has union with Jesus empowered you to be "alive" and "fruitful" (Jn 15:5)? How are you doing with that?

**Friday:** Gen 1:3-13. Can you see any parallel between how God creates the world, and how he re-creates in Christ (e.g. Ezek 37:1-4, 2 Cor 5:17, John 3:3, 5, 20:22)? Praise God for his saving work in you! Pray that God would to this in our local and foreign missions.

Saturday: Gen 3:14-31. How does God fill the earth?
