

DAILY DEVOTIONS

Memory Text — Genesis 1:28 ²⁸ And God blessed them. And God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

Congregation's Response at Baptism: "As [name] is baptized into Christ and becomes a member of his visible church, the whole congregation is obligated to love (him/her) and receive (him/her) as a member of the body of Christ. For "we were all baptized by one Spirit into one body," and therefore are members of one another. Christ claims this little child as his own and calls you to receive (him/her) in love and commitment. Therefore, you ought to commit yourself before God to assist [name of child] and (his/her) parents in (his/her) Christian nurture by godly example, prayer, and encouragement in our most precious faith."

Monday: Gen 1:26-28. What is God's vision for the earth regarding mankind (v 28)? Is God simply looking for lots of humans, or more (v 28, Jn 4:23, Rev 7:9ff)? What is the means by which this will be accomplished (v 28)? Do you think and act as his godly child? How might our common origin (Adam, Eve) be intended to shape our care and concern for one another? Do you reflect this?

Tuesday: Gen 1:28. How does v 28 argue against Egypt/Canaan fertility cults? What is the significant of "God blessed them" preceding v 28ff? What does v 28 command? Why? What implications does this have for married couples? What sorrows can you think of related to v 28? Pray for society to develop a high view of children and parenting, for children in tough situations, and longing and hurting adults.

Wednesday: Gen 1:28. Many countries have very low birth rates (US in 2022 was 1.66). What thinking/priorities may this reveal? Do you think birth control is used too easily? How does God view children (v 28, Ps 127:3-5, Mt 19:14, Mk 10:13)? How do you communicate/reflect a positive view of children (and parenting), whether your own or not?

Thursday: Gen 1:28, Gen 9:1, 7. After the fall God reiterates this command. Is God's vision after the fall still "a world teeming with godly image bearers"? How does this happen in covenant families? How are parents to nurture the "godly" part? What responsibility do we all have to those not yet "children of God" (Mt 28:18ff)? How are you being faithful in that realm?

Friday: Gen 1:28. Because children of believers are part of the covenant community, what responsibility lies on all of us toward them (see baptism quote above)? What can this look like for seniors? Singles? Empty nesters? You? How have you observed this already functioning at New Hope? Praise God for that. How can you participate more in this grand vision of God for godly children?

Saturday: Gen 1:28-31. What responsibilities does God lay on man regarding creation? What are we to do with that?
